



FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents,

Disrupted Enrolments Season for 2021: Extended to Term 3

A team of staff has been observing prospective new students for enrolment in 2021 during the latter part of this term. Subsequently, the Registrar Terry Williamson and I have been in a series of enrolment interviews. With the Covid-19 situation we recognise it has been difficult for prospective families to get observations and to tours and to see their therapists and be able to submit the various reports necessary for enrolment here. Nonetheless the process continues and will do so again during Term 3 as well. If parents know of families of children with a disability in their network who would benefit from an education here please do reach out to them and encourage them to apply. It is not too late for enrolment in Kindergarten and Year 7 for 2021 entry. Please encourage any such contacts in your network to email or phone Terry accordingly.

Building Works and Preparation for the Big Move:

Well the works are now focussed on the driveway from Billyard into the underground staff carpark and parent pickup/drop off area. Although the car park is completed the driveway is yet to be completed and is the focus of a lot of external activity by the builders. External landscaping is also a prime and continuing focus especially on the side within the campus. Staff are commencing packing up materials from their current classrooms to be moved in the holidays in readiness for the commencement of Term 3 when all classrooms will be in operation for teaching and learning by staff and students. There has been the first major clean of the building this week with more cleaning to continue over the next few weeks. The builder is cleaning using certified VOC products to ensure the safety of the students and staff when we move in to the building.

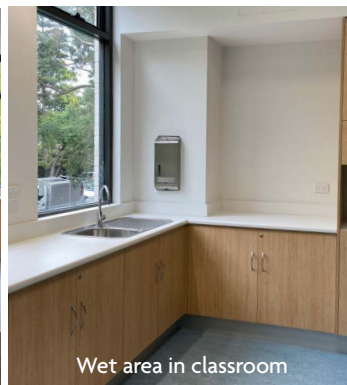

The theme for this year's NAIDOC Week is 'Always Was, Always Will Be', and the KARI Foundation work with education sectors and other community stakeholders in raising awareness of the need to preserve the cultural heritage of our Indigenous peoples. They also assist those of Aboriginal descent to know and understand their family history and indigenous roots. It is organisations like this that we hope will embed within our national psyche the importance of honouring and respecting the richness of our Indigenous cultures and how they shape us as a nation in the past, present and future!

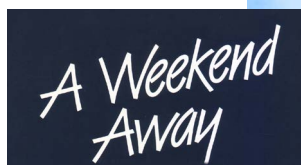
Help us create our own on-site supermarket at St Lucy's School

THERAPY TEAM

Hello from the Therapy Team,

This newsletter we thought we would focus on hand dominance and knowing our writing hand.

Hand dominance typically develops between 2-4 years old and should be consolidated between 4-6 years old.

Preference for one hand can be seen in daily tasks like: hair brushing, brushing teeth or academic tasks such as: handwriting and scissors skills.

One way you can test your child's hand dominance is by placing a utensil in his/her midline (centre of the body) &

seeing which hand s/he reaches for it with.

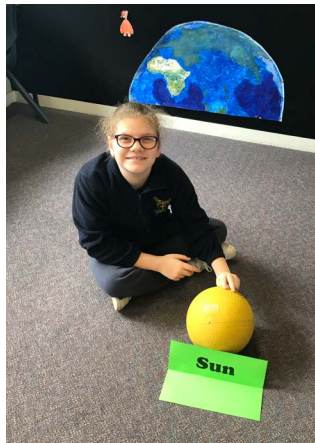

NDIS Support Letters & Attending NDIS Plan Meetings

I want remind families to continue giving me at least 1 month's notice to put together support letters from our school for NDIS Plan Meetings or Reviews. Your communication and notice have been much appreciated. With less notice it can be challenging to put together sufficient information. Feel free to email me when your next NDIS Plan Meeting is, so I can send you a helpful reminder.

If you require, I can also attend NDIS Plan Meetings, or arrange an advocate/support co-ordinator to attend with you. Let me know as soon as you can for this to occur. I encourage families to continue their thorough preparation for their Plan Meetings. Make sure you check in with myself prior to meetings, obtain necessary reports, get quotes for future services and have written down clear needs and future goals for your son/daughter's future plan.

St Lucy's Food Meals and Hampers

As you may have noticed we have been sending meals and hampers for families. This comes from our volunteers, Hornsby Connect and recent funding support from the Ku-ring-gai Council. As a school we work to identify families who for various reasons

we want to support on a certain week.
