Parent Pick Up and Drop Off Arrangements:

Next week from Monday we will commence a trial of the new arrangements for **afternoons only for Primary students for the last week of Term 3**. We will be implementing the use of the underground car park mornings and afternoons from Term 4. Please read the outline from the previous Newsletter repeated here for your information and contact the school if you chose to use this new facility on a permanent basis from Monday onwards. We will make any necessary adjustments at the commencement of Term 4 on the basis of the trail next week.

GENERAL:

Parents intending to use the underground driveway for pick up must inform the school in advance – leigh-annh@stlucys.nsw.edu.au. The underground car park arrangement is for those parents for whom it will be a regular and ongoing arrangement rather than on a day by day or ad hoc basis. Please specify which days of the week you will be picking up your child using the underground driveway.

Parents are still welcome to park and drop off or pick up their child via foot from/to the Gallery door on Cleveland Street.

St Lucy's will provide you with a sign with your child's name to place on your windshield.

Parents should enter the car park by turning left into the driveway off Billyard Avenue. This is to avoid congestion of right turning vehicles.

Follow the arrows which will lead you in a U-shape around the car park starting on the left-hand side.

All stationary cars should have their engines turned off.

On reaching the line closest to the glass vestibule – please park your car and come to the door to drop off or collect your child/young person from/to the staff member on duty.

Please then return to your car promptly, ensuring your young person is secured (for pick up), and exit the driveway. A reminder that drop off and pick up times are not a time for handover of information between staff and parents/carers.

A staff traffic marshall will then direct the cars on the other side of the car park to move up and those in the line nearest to the glass vestibule should then follow the same procedure (above).

All speed and other signs need to be obeyed as a 4 kmph zone either off Cleveland Street or Billyard Avenue.

Entry and exit to the car park off Billyard is a two-way traffic area so please stay on your side of the driveway and be aware of cars coming in the other direction.

There is a height restriction for cars of 2.1m – please do not enter the underground car park if you think your car is close to this height as it could do damage to the sewage pipes.

FOR PRIMARY STUDENTS:

Drop off

The car park will be opened to parents between 8.30 to 8.50am from first day of Term 4.

Pick up

Parent pick up for primary students will be from 2.40 – 2.50pm. The car park will be opened to parents at 2.30pm. Students will be brought to the glass vestibule area at 2.40pm. Underground car park will close at 3pm for parent pick up, after that time pick up will be from Cleveland Street.

As we all get used to this wonderful new facility, we need to take extra care for the safety of all and use it wisely. Thank you in advance for your careful attention to these details. Also please be patient with staff, as with any new procedure, there may be a need to make changes once we have trialled the arrangements for a period of time.

FOR SECONDARY STUDENTS: DO NOT USE UNDERGROUND DRIVEWAY

Drop off

Given the small number of high school students in 2020 -Parent and taxi drop off will be through the Cleveland Street driveway from 8.20 – 8.30 as per current arrangements. Parents of Secondary students can still park and drop off their young person by foot through the Gallery.

Pick up

Parent pick up for high school students will be between 3.00 and 3.10pm. Any late arriving parents, should pick up at Cleveland Street.

Bishop Anthony Randazzo has recently launched a Rights of the Child Framework as an initiative of Safeguarding Awareness Month. The Diocese of Broken Bay has dedicated September to Safeguarding and has chosen as a theme for 2020, "Promoting Rights of the Child".

Bishop Randazzo made it a priority to express the spiritual rights alongside the natural rights identified by the United Nations.

"In the community of the Church, these human rights of the child are grounded in the truth that each child is made in the image and likeness of God, with unique beauty and dignity. Each child is known and loved by God. The Framework is one of the many ways in which we are living out our commitment to forming communities of safety and care, especially for our children," said Bishop Anthony.


THERAPY TEAM NEWS

Hello from the Therapy Team,

Recently we came across a great & informative website called 'The AAC coach' (https://www.theaaccoach.com/), which has some fabulous visuals and practical info about using Augmentative & Alternative Communication (i.e. AAC). The thing that caught our eye was the importance of 'wait time' and allowing the child enough time to respond using their AAC system, whether it be: key word signs, visuals, or an iPad App like proloquo2go or LAMP. The AAC coach recommends that after you speak you will probably need to give your child between 15-60sec wait time as there's a lot for them to consider & coordinate. See the great explanation in the diagram to the right:

Over the last couple of years, the St Lucy's Community has proudly supported the 'Fiver For A Farmer' initiative that started in response to the severe impact the drought was having on our farming communities.

Once again this year, we will be directing our end of term fundraiser to our farming communities by sending the money raised to RuralAid. As with many areas and industries impacted by COVID-19, our farming communities have also suffered. Whilst the drought has somewhat 'broken', many crops have been unable to be properly harvested due to a lack of human resources; financial hardships have hit our farming communities due to a drop in demand for agricultural exports; and the increased need for counselling support due to the impact of COVID-19 has become a major focus in rural communities. RuralAid assist our rural and farming communities in supporting them through any major crisis that heavily impacts them. So, next Friday 25th September, the St Lucy's community will be asking our students (and staff) to come dressed as a farmer and donate a fiver (ie \$5 per family) in support of our awesome farmers.
