

In the busy-ness of our lives, and in the planning for this upcoming Easter break, it is easy to forget the true meaning of this Christian Season. It is a time when we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus, which was a sign to all, as to the fullness of God's Love. As well, it signifies the beginnings of the birth of our Christian faith, and the realisation that we are one with God. Wishing you all a very happy, holy and safe upcoming Easter holiday!

Other significant religious holidays! Not only is there significant happenings taking place in Christianity, but also in Hinduism and Judaism!

Many of our Hindu families recently celebrated Holi. Holi is a festival held in the Northern Hemisphere's Spring time to signify the end of Winter, and the triumph of good over evil. Known as the 'festival of colours', Hindus find many colourful ways to celebrate, one of which is to throw coloured powder called 'gulal'. It is also a time for friends and family to come together and share in this special occasion. This festival recently took place on 28th-29th March.

For our Jewish families, they are currently in the midst of their 8-day festival of Passover or Pesach. This celebration began on the 27th March and will continue until the 4th April. Pesach commemorates the emancipation of the Israelites from slavery in Egypt. Ways that the Jewish people mark this special occasion is by gathering with family and friends, re-telling the story of the Exodus, avoiding yeast (or leaven) and engaging in a Seder meal. It is this meal that Jesus was celebrating with his friends when they gathered in Jerusalem, for what Christians now refer to as The Last Supper.

To all our Hindu and Jewish families and staff – wishing you many blessings for these special moments within your faith traditions!


