Relaxation of Some COVID Restrictions:

With the relaxation of restrictions gradually occurring as we progress through the year the time has now come to resume Assemblies and invite parents more fully back on site. We are very excited by this resumption of assemblies and have even been practising with the students at both a primary and secondary assembly. Mother's Day Assembly and Stall:





Carers NSW April – June 2021 training calendar

Carers NSW offers a number of free workshops and training for carers, carer support groups, service providers and anyone providing support to a carer. The education and training calendar is updated each month to help you plan ahead for any topics of interest.

A carer is any individual who provides care and support to a family member or friend who has a disability, mental illness, drug and/or alcohol dependency, chronic condition, terminal illness or who is frail.

Workshops are currently being delivered online using the Zoom videoconferencing platform. You will need access to a computer with speakers (a microphone and video camera are a bonus). Carers NSW will send you instructions about how you can join the session on confirmation of your registration.

Caring through Crisis: COVID-19

This 1½ hour session provides carers with an opportunity to connect, share experiences and strategies in caring through COVID-19. As we continue to live with the impacts of COVID-19 this session focuses on strategies for self-care, addressing barriers to service delivery, identifying strategies to address the needs of the person being cared for in the current environment and information about where to access up to date information and supports.

Participants will also receive a handbook, with information about keeping safe and well, a self-care action plan, and a list of resources with links to information and supports available.

Caring Through Crisis: Disaster planning

This 2 hour workshop provides carers with an opportunity to plan ahead for future emergencies, especially when caring for someone with complex needs. Future Matters: The importance of carers planning ahead

Planning for the future can be challenging for carers, many of whom avoid thinking about future needs for themselves and the person they care for, until they are in crisis. This 1½ hour session provides an overview of the legal, medical, financial and other practical considerations in planning for the future. The session also provides information, tools and supports to help plan and prepare to transition someone to aged and/or end of life care and an opportunity to reflect on the emotional impacts carers may experience at this time.

- Week 3: Strategies to take care of your own health and wellbeing
- Week 4: Assisting someone with daily activities like personal care, eating, drinking and transport
- Week 5: Moving someone safely, including safe body position, common transfers and instructional videos
- Week 6: Information and advice on falls prevention, medications, planning ahead and palliative care.


