Staff Training:

We commenced the term as a staff with a liturgy and two days of professional learning which covered off CPR/ First Aid as well as the Crisis Prevention Institute – Safety Intervention Course (previously known to some as MAPA). The CPI course covered the topics of the Crisis Development Model, Integrated Experience, Communication Skills, Responding to Defensive Behaviours, Safety Interventions, Disengagement Skills, Restrictive Interventions, Decision Making, Holding Skills, Post Crisis Responses. It combined on-line learning and practical sessions to practise the recommended techniques of calming an escalating student behaviour and help keep students and staff as safe as possible. Our thanks to Kathleen Walsh for organising our CPR session as well as Mimi Fraser and Lynne Pinker for being our train the trainers. In addition, there were various planning meetings and time for class teams to meet and prepare the classroom itself for the commencement of the year.

Covid Update:

Thank you for your cooperation with the RAT testing each Monday and Wednesday morning. We are due to receive our next batch of tests at school at some point during next week and will let you know the arrangements for the next distribution of tests for Weeks 3 and 4.

Just a few quick reminders:

- Parents/carers are to remember if your child or young person has tested positive to Covid to register the results on the Service NSW app and contact the school asap and forward your notice to absent@stlucys.nsw.edu.au.
- If your child or young person is displaying any Covid symptoms, they are to stay home, have a PCR test and only return if a negative result is received and experiencing no symptoms.
- High school students must wear masks at any time while indoors unless the student in question has a significant aversion to wearing a mask. Primary students are strongly encouraged to also wear a mask when indoors. Any mask is better than no mask but preferably not vented masks or cloth masks. The ideal is to wear a surgical quality or similar mask which gives better protection.
- If anyone in your household tests positive, your St Lucy's child is required to complete 7 days of isolation and return after a negative RAT.
- Please continue to advise us as your child receives their vaccinations.

Car Park Reminder:

Parents are requested to turn LEFT when turning IN to the car park off Billyard and turn LEFT when turning OUT. This is so we maximise your safety and that of your children in what can be a very busy zone of congested traffic especially in the afternoon pick up period when street vision is restricted. Please also remain in your vehicle and turn the engine off when below and drop and collect your child from the door, so we maintain the air quality for all concerned.

In the afternoons when your child is brought down to the glass vestibule exit the vehicle and go to the door to collect and load them. Also, if we can ensure we all move our cars as far forward as possible when traffic clears to allow as many cars to be loaded simultaneously to help speed the process of pick up and drop off. Thanks for your patience and support of these measures. Further, given the high numbers of families now using the underground car park we will be introducing a new system next week to better manage the flow of traffic. This will include name cards for your windscreen.

Parent Information Night: 17 February 2022

PIN will take place on Tuesday 17 February at 6pm and will be via Teams. This is an opportunity to link with your class team and hear all the nitty gritty practical details about the class and what your teaching team need from you to assist the cause of learning for our students. Each class will suggest some items (Wish List) that parents may wish to group together and provide funds for so that these can be purchased for your specific class needs. This is the only fundraising 'ask' we make of parents each year. More information will be sent by your class team shortly.

Individual Education Plan Meetings:

IEPs will be held in Week 6 starting from Monday 28 February through to Friday 4 March and your class team will let you know nearer the time of the particular day and booking arrangements and details. These important goal setting meetings can be held face to face or via Teams if you prefer. You are welcome to involve external therapists at these meeting to assist in the close cooperation between home and school as the goals for this Semester are set for your child or young person. It will be a pupil free day on the day of your child's IEP meeting. Child minding for St Lucy's students will be available for the IEP meeting and specialist meetings at Wahroonga campus.

Please note that satellite class IEPs will be held at Wahroonga campus not the respective host school sites unless otherwise specified by your class teacher.

Vocational Educational Training (VET):

This week a group of our Stage 5 students attended their first VET (Vocational Educational Training) session! St Lucy's is offering the Certificate I in Active Volunteering in 2022 to students in Years 9 and 10 as an elective subject. The students will engage in units of work that teach them about the role of volunteer workers and equip them with the foundation skills that they are required to have to effectively undertake volunteer work. In the first session students completed a mandatory Induction Program and then their Language, Literacy and Numeracy Assessment. 

Our year 7 students have settled in well to High School and had a great week. They are enjoying being part of the big kids gang!




Year 10 Food Technology

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND PASTORAL CARE

Even though we were unable to physically come together as a school for our Opening School Liturgy, all teachers created a sacred space in their classroom and engaged in prayer and reflection centred on the theme of new beginnings. Sr Helen and I agreed that an appropriate Gospel passage for this event would be The Road to Emmaus.

Located in the final chapter of the Gospel of Luke, The Road to Emmaus is a simple yet beautiful story about two of Jesus' disciples who are deeply distressed and confused, as they are trying to come to terms with Jesus' death. They then find themselves in deep conversation with the risen Jesus himselfonly they do not recognise him. companion to stay with them and instead of continuing in his journey, Jesus agrees.

When they are at the table, Jesus gives thanks and breaks the bread with them: it is then that they recognize Him. Immediately, Jesus disappears, and they rush back to Jerusalem that very evening, find the 11 apostles, and tell them what happened.

The ancient wisdom in this story is still pertinent for today because so often it is easy for us to become blinkered and lose sight of the love, joy and hope that is always present in our daily lives.
