Nevertheless, we anticipate there will be a gradual relaxation of restrictions this term.

It is still very important that we all remain vigilant if symptoms develop and undertake RAHT testing in case. Plus, it is important to only return to school after a negative RAHT test and if there are no symptoms. A further batch of testing kits will be distributed shortly via student bags to assist in this process of surveillance. For the moment staff and all visiting adults and as many students as possible will be required to wear masks when indoors. In these ways students, staff and families can be best kept safe from Covid. Please do keep getting your children vaccinated, as and when appropriate, so we have as many of our students fully vaccinated. Remember that all staff are at least double if not fully boosted as well in terms of Covid vaccination.

Flu Vaccination:

It is anticipated that this winter the flu will be quite intense. Consequently, it is highly recommended to be vaccinated as soon as possible. Please arrange for your child to be vaccinated, if that is your wish, to assist the cause of keeping everyone as healthy as possible in the next few months. Staff are also undertaking these vaccinations to play their part as well.

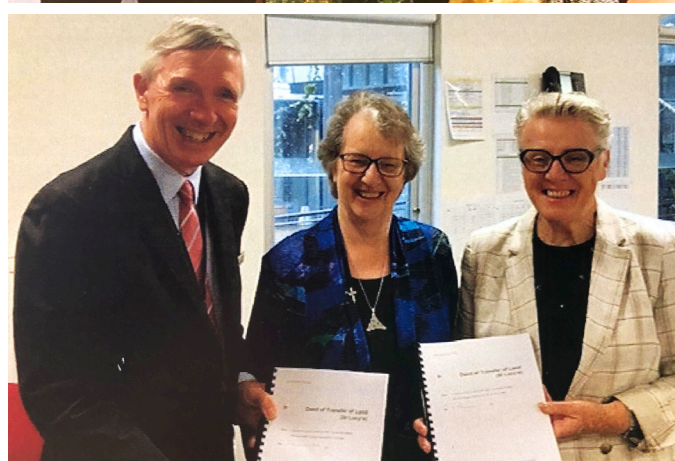
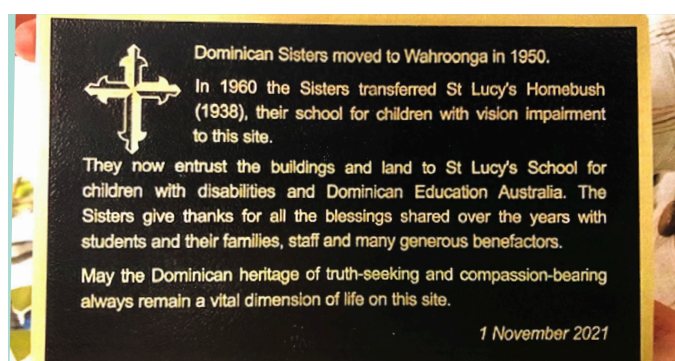
New Family Picnic:

PRAYING FOR PEACE IN THE UKRAINE

I am sure that you have been deeply troubled by the war in the Ukraine. Whilst we are unable to influence President Putin, or the course of the war (though we can donate to humanitarian groups on the ground), as a faith community, we believe that praying for peace is one way we can help.

Author and Jesuit priest, James Martin, recently stated that we need to pray for peace because:

Peace and unity are at the heart of the Christian message. *We should beg God to help us effect this peace, especially in war-torn places like Ukraine.*

I thought I would share with you an extract from a beautiful prayer which Pope Francis recently delivered in Rome:

Pope Francis' Prayer for the Ukraine

To the Immaculate Heart of Mary Basilica of Saint Peter 25 March 2022

O Mary, Mother of God and our Mother, in this time of trial we turn to you. As our Mother, you love us and know us: no concern of our hearts is hidden from you.

Mother of mercy, how often we have experienced your watchful care and your peaceful presence!
You never cease to guide us to Jesus, the Prince of Peace

Now, O Mother, repeat those words and that prayer, for in our own day we have run out of the wine of hope, joy has fled, fraternity has faded.

How greatly we need your maternal help!

Therefore, O Mother, hear our prayer. Star of the Sea, do not let us be shipwrecked in the tempest of war.

Ark of the New Covenant, inspire projects and paths of reconciliation.

Queen of Heaven, restore God's peace to the world. Eliminate hatred and the thirst for revenge, and teach us forgiveness.

Free us from war, protect our world from the menace of nuclear weapons. Queen of the Rosary, make us realise our need to pray and to love.

Queen of the Human Family, show people the path of fraternity. Queen of Peace, obtain peace for our world.

May you, our "living fountain of hope", water the dryness of our hearts. In your womb Jesus took flesh; help us to foster the growth of communion. You once trod the streets of our world; lead us now on the paths of peace.

ST LUCY'S SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM 2022

Many thanks to the parents and caregivers who have been in contact about our sacramental programs. Just a reminder that we need to receive your paperwork so that we can proceed with our enrolment process.

Wednesday, 8th June, we will commence our first Confirmation preparation lesson with the students.

The Confirmation ritual will be held on site at St. Lucy's on **Thursday, 23rd June at 10.30am**, and the presider will be Bishop Anthony Randazzo.

I will be hosting an online information session for parents and caregivers of any student who has signed up to make their Confirmation on **Tuesday, 10th May at 6pm**.

Just a reminder: in our Diocese of Broken Bay, **Confirmation** is celebrated after Baptism, but before Reconciliation and First Eucharist.

As such, any student who is already confirmed, or is confirmed in June 2022, can also complete their other two sacraments this year in Term 3.

We are very fortunate to have such strong ties with our local Parish, *Holy Name Wahroonga*, and Fr Paul Durkin will preside over our Reconciliation and First Eucharist rituals – dates are still to be confirmed.
