Individual Education Plan Meetings:

I trust the IEP meeting went well for you all with the class teams this week. Although it had to be online during this latest Omicron wave we always enjoy seeing you, the mums and dads of the students, to learn more about your children and how we can best support you all.

Covid Vaccinations and Boosters:

I am pleased to let you know that 14 staff who were eligible for their fourth Covid booster vaccination have undertaken this important next step last week in a clinic which we ran in partnership with Wahroonga Family Medical Practice. I also know that a number of other staff have also arranged their booster privately or are planning to do so when eligible. This will keep each staff member safe as well as their families and we hope the students in their care as well. I hope you as parents continue to get boosted too and as many of our eligible students complete their double dose vaccinations as well. This will also help keep our whole community more Covid safe and continue to build immunity.

Student Assemblies:

We have resumed assemblies for both high school and primary students and continue to do so with just staff and students present for the moment. The students have been responding well to getting into the rhythm and routine of assembly despite the numbers and noise involved. We still plan to resume these events for parents as soon as we can.

School Camps:

We took the decision to postpone the Stage 3 Camp this term and move it to a date to be fixed in Term 4. Meanwhile the Stage 4 Camp is still going ahead later this term at this point but the program will be planned day activities only and not overnight. We expect the latest Omicron wave to have subsided by the closing stages of the term and so we are pressing ahead with that camp but in a modified form.

Annual Fundraising Lunch Invitation:

We are resuming our annual Fundraising Lunch this year at the Fullerton Hotel on Thursday 22nd September at 12.45pm and parents would have received an invitation to attend if you so wish. WE REMEMBER ST DOMINIC

St Dominic - 1170-1221 Feast Day 3 August (1170 – 6 August 1221) He was born in Caleruega, Spain. He is sometimes called Dominic of Osma or Dominic de Guzmán. He was educated by his uncle, a priest. Dominic became a priest and joined a religious community. Soon he became the prior, or head. Dominic saw that those sent by the Pope to preach, lived in comfort. The people would not accept their teaching. Dominic, his bishop, and three Cistercian monks persevered going from city to city preaching the truth of Christ, using the Bible. They went on foot, depending on others for food and a place to sleep. Soon people returned to the faith—not only because of what these preachers said, but because of how they lived. By 1215 a few men had joined Dominic in his work of preaching. He founded the Order of Preachers, better known as the Dominicans. While St. Dominic was on a preaching mission through northern Italy, he died, only six years after he had founded his community.
