Martin de Porres grew up in extreme poverty after his dad left him, his mum and sister when Martin was very young. As a result, Martin was sent to work and gain a trade at the age of 7. He volunteered at a Dominican Monastery in his early teenage years, later taking his vows and becoming a Dominican. Throughout much of his life, Martin experienced racist taunts and mistreatment, which encouraged him all the more to become an advocate for the downtrodden, showing much compassion and care for one and all.




