the June/July school holidays. This includes site preparation, installation of hoardings to secure the building site and moving Peony class from the demountable and ball court area to the library. The builder's hoarding will be erected across the oval area and the swings will not be able to be accessed. Consequently, many of our usual regulation spaces will be unavailable during these initial works which have been scheduled for the holidays. A variety of trades will also be in attendance across the campus.

Consequently, we have reluctantly been forced to cancel the next Creative Arts Holiday Program. We absolutely know this is not at all ideal for many of our families who rely on this additional service during the holiday period. Nevertheless, the safety of the students engaging in the Creative Arts Holiday Program (without their regular regulation spaces), is an absolute priority and must override the convenience this program provides for our families. By giving you, our parents, as much notice as possible of this cancellation, and by working together with our Family Support Worker, Justine Spurrs, it is hoped that alternative external programs can be accessed or plans put in place for individual support in the community. Covid Update:

Just a few quick reminders:

Parents/carers are to remember if your child or young person has tested positive to Covid to register the results on the Service NSW app and contact the school asap and forward your notice to absent@stlucys.nsw.edu.au.

If your child or young person is displaying any Covid symptoms, they are to stay home, have a PCR test and only return if a negative result is received and experiencing no symptoms.

If anyone in your household tests positive, your St Lucy's child is required to complete 5 days of isolation and return after a negative RAT.

Please continue to advise us as your child receives their vaccinations.


RELIGIOUS EDUCATION AND PASTORAL CARE

Turning 16... and Disability Supports

Disability Support Pension (DSP)

This is payment for people who have been assessed as having a significant disability. You must meet some rules to get the Disability Support Pension. On the Services Australia website, there is a pre claim link to check to see if your young person is eligible. Your Centrelink account should be linked to myGov so you can apply online.

Documentation needed:

- Specialist medical reports
- Allied health services reports
- School reports
- 100 points of Identification

The more supporting documentation you can gather, the better. This can take time, so we recommend you start early.

Carer Allowance

Before your child's 16th birthday, you can start gathering supporting documentation to go with the DSP application. The ADAT is an assessment tool that carers and the child's health professional must use. Documents may include:

- Proof of ID
- Letter from GP
- Specialist medical reports



High School Development: Catherine Centre

During 2023/24 our state-of-the-art, architect designed Catherine Centre classrooms and specialist high school facilities will be constructed at the Wahroonga campus. This includes 12 classrooms with adjacent designated Year 7-12 adolescent centred recreational spaces as well as refurbished whole school playground spaces. At St Lucy's we believe our classrooms and related playgrounds are essential learning environments where your children, our students, form friendships and connections for life.

As government funding does not fund playgrounds, we seek your help.

Your child deserves the best most sensory and exciting play spaces to engage with others, learn in their own safe environment, explore and regulate.

The construction of the Catherine Centre requires significant earthworks beyond the building itself to help make the whole K-12 playground accessible and fit for purpose. The new playground areas will be available for your child and importantly be accessible to both our Senior and Primary students: including new swings, new climbing spider frame, new wheelchair accessible trampolines, a basketball hoop with Softfall, outdoor dance stage area, a covered walkway link to the whole school, and restored bike track and related fencing. With construction costs and Softfall and Astroturf areas, the total estimated cost is in excess of \$500,000. Please join us, together with your family network of grandparents, aunts, uncles, neighbours, friendship groups and work colleagues. Pledge as much support as you and they can, to the Playground Pledge for the direct benefit of your child now and in the future, as they continue their educational journey with St Lucy's to Year 12.

Each new high school classroom includes a core explicit instruction teaching area with kitchen facility and social area for eating and gathering together as well as two complementary learning spaces: one for small group work and the other for student regulation. Modern toilet facilities and change places are also incorporated as well as lifts and access ramps. The Catherine Centre is situated on the campus so that our children have easy access to the oval, the bike track and swimming pool. As part of this project a renovation of an existing facility will accommodate a Vocational Education Training facility for Hospitality and adjacent dining room.

In 2017 the school was able to purchase neighbouring land. In 2020 the construction of the Dominic Centre (new K-6 classrooms) was completed and the Catherine Centre (Years 7-12 classrooms) will commence building in 2023. These two developments will accommodate specialised teaching and learning spaces needed for education in the 21st century in a specialist setting for students with a disability across K-12.
