

Covid and Influenza Procedures

We continue to ask parents to be especially vigilant about Covid and flu at this winter season. At school we continue to wear masks wherever possible indoors together to help prevent the spread of infection. A large number of both students and staff are susceptible to these infections and we wish to all work together to prevent the spread. If if your child is displaying any cold/flu symptoms, regardless of if they're testing negative to Covid, they need to remain at home until symptom free to break the cycle of illnesses. Our current school policy still remains that if your child tests positive to Covid they must isolate for 7 days and return a negative RAT on day 6 in order to return after 7days. If someone in your household tests positive, then your child is deemed a close contact and must isolate for 5 days and return

a negative RAT prior to returning to school.

Mission

The month of May concludes with the beginning of Australia's National Reconciliation Week.

Thank you to the Orchid class, for preparing a beautiful liturgy, which focuses on the importance of reconciliation. Our students are always very respectful when they are provided with opportunities to engage with the culture and history of Australia's Indigenous people.

In a school where we promote Dominican Values as a way of life, we are naturally committed to expressing regret for injustices of the past. On that note, I am conscious that there has been a great deal of media attention related to the referendum which will decide whether we will enshrine an indigenous voice to parliament in our constitution.

As such, I would like to recommend Frank Brennan SJ's article, <u>How to Vote on The Voice</u>. Here, he refers to "ten steps for Catholics inspired by our Catholic social teaching when approaching the forthcoming referendum." He recently published a new book, An Indigenous Voice to Parliament: Considering a Constitutional Bridge. You may be interested in the <u>Virtual Book Launch</u> (Fr. Frank begins speaking at 7mins 15secs). This book outlines both the `Yes' and `No' cases so that voters can have an opportunity to form a personal view before voting in the upcoming referendum.

Turning 16... and Disability Supports

Disability Support Pension (DSP)

This is payment for people who have been assessed as having a significant disability. You must meet some rules to get the Disability Support Pension. On the Services Australia website, there is a pre claim link to check to see if your young person is eligible. Your Centrelink account should be linked to myGov so you can apply online.

Documentation needed:

- Specialist medical reports
- Allied health services reports
- School reports
- 100 points of Identification

The more supporting documentation you can gather, the better. This can take time, so we recommend you start early.

Carer Allowance

Before your child's 16th birthday, you can start gathering supporting documentation to go with the DSP application. The ADAT is an assessment tool that carers and the child's health professional must use. Documents may include:

- Proof of ID
- Letter from GP
- Specialist medical reports


