FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents.

Welcome Back:

I hope you managed to juggle some time to be with loved ones these holidays. I know many took the opportunity of the Holiday Program at School in the first week to assist with family time. Thanks to the staff for their organisation, planning and delivery of the Holiday Program and especially Lynne Pinker and Ali Picone.

Royal Commission Recommendations into Disability:

You will be as shocked as I was that one of the recommendations from the Royal Commission was the dismantling of Special Needs Schools such as St Lucy's by 2051. Although I note it was a split decision across the 6 Commissioners with three in favour of full inclusion of students with disability in mainstream settings and three Commissioners suggesting alternatives. Certainly, the alternative suggestions seemed to me to be very much in keeping with the custom and practice of St Lucy's both at Wahroonga and in our Satellite program by partnering with nearby schools in a variety of activities to expose our students to mainstream settings and students and experiences of inclusion.

One of our parents advocated for St Lucy's after the recommendations were made public and consequently the ABC were interested to interview the parent as well as myself and visit the school to see for themselves the type of inclusive programs and activities we use here. The material will be included in a 7.30 Report program shortly and have discussion of both sides of the argument. It should be noted that the Recommendations of the Commission will be responded to by the Federal Government early next year.

In the meantime if you have a view on the matter feel free, if you so wish, to write to your local State and Federal members of Parliament as well as advocate for your choice and continuing experience of St Lucy's for your child and young person and the social good we provide.



Building Progress:

During the recent holidays COWYN Building Group have made continuing excellent progress on the Catherine Centre (12 secondary classrooms). The next steps are the excavations within the new external play areas; form work and reinforcement to the recently poured first floor slab; final major concrete pour on the first floor slab (this will be the last major pour for the project); form work and reinforcement of the columns to first floor. Satellite Classes and the Catholic Schools Office, Broken Bay (CSBB) and Bishop's Vision:

I would like to provide all parents across the school community with an update on the most recent outcome of negotiations and discussions with the Catholic Schools Office, Broken Bay (CSBB) regarding the satellite locations at Narrabeen and Narraweena and at Prouille. After representations from our trustees Dominican Education Australia (DEA) and St Lucy's Board, the Bishop/CSBB has not granted further time at the Narraweena campus for a St Lucy's class beyond December 2024 but has done so for an additional year at Narrabeen by allowing the continuation of the two classes for two years ending in December 2025.

Regarding the Prouille satellite location: I can confirm the Prouille satellite will cease at Prouille in December 2023 as previously communicated. It has been confirmed that two classes for 2 years (2024 and 2025) will be made available at Sacred Heart Catholic Primary School, Pymble as the alternative site for the Prouille satellite classes.

I want to reassure all parents that the St Lucy's Board is committed to continue the satellite program. We are actively looking for partner schools in the wider northern beaches area for 2025 and onwards as well as further afield. In recent times, I have approached some 10 schools to see if they have spare classroom capacity or a small parcel of land for our use to create new satellite campuses. I will keep you posted on any progress in due course as these matters will take considerable time to negotiate.

Staff Professional Development Day

We met as a whole staff on Monday the 9th of October for our Annual Retreat Day. We were treated to a presentation by Sr Elizabeth Hellwig OP who shared the history of Dominic and the history of the first Dominican nuns who came to Australia and set up a school in Maitland. We were then encouraged to reflect on our values in action and identify our strengths, all the while listening to our hearts as we prepare for the busy Term ahead. Many thanks to Liz Webster who prepared the day for the staff.

FW: Beauty and the Beast - Access and Inclusion Sessions



Disney Theatrical Productions is proud to be partnering with Autism Spectrum Australia (Aspect), the Capitol Theatre and Ticketmaster to offer a relaxed performance of Beauty and the Beast on Saturday the 18th of November at 1:30 pm. This unique and inclusive performance will be tailored, from start to finish, to support audience members who may need specific support.

A relaxed performance means that audience members will be encouraged to be completely themselves during the performance; to make sounds, move around, fidget or use noise-cancelling headphones.

Aspect's Autistic staff assessed the show and recommended modifications for the relaxed performance so people with sensory sensitivities are considered and cared for at all touchpoints. Adjustments include a visual story that explains the show step by step, inclusive and welcoming language used on the official website and during the ticket-buying process, increased staff and volunteers to assist audience members, turning off all announcements throughout the theatre, and providing a quiet room and quiet spaces equipped with sensory coping tools. Amendments to the production for the cast and crew include noise reduction, keeping the house lights dim during the performance, and employing visual cues to act as a 'pre-warning' mechanism prior to potentially overwhelming scenes or moments.




