

Today the staff and students came together to remember Sanad in a special liturgy within the Primary and then the Secondary school. Sanad's staff in Peony Class, helped lead these services with a special poem written by his teacher, and his two teacher aides edited a video of special moments in his learning journey here at St Lucy's. They were such moving and courageous tributes. These liturgies were a chance for us as staff and students to join to remember, reflect upon and celebrate Sanad's life among us. We are grateful for the friendship he brought to St Lucy's and to Peony Class as he let his light shine so fully into our lives here at school speaking his truth. We are grateful for his special gifts and for his smile. The artwork above was created by Sanad last week. He delighted in making it and was happy with his finished product. I'm sure you will agree that it is lovely.

We are very grateful for the support that we had last week from the emergency services and the immediate help that arrived from our Chair of the Board, Mary L'Estrange and from AIS NSW to assist us in this tragic situation.

In these following days we are being held together by the outpouring of love and kindness that flowed into this school from all quarters, especially from our parents. Our first flowers arrived anonymously that same afternoon from a neighbour who had just heard the news and simply felt they had to do something.

Thank you to the schools and networks that reached out to us which are too many to list here. I had a constant stream of messages with support and offers of practical assistance.

This week, from Monday, the students returning to school brought the light and the joy back into St Lucy's. Your children and young adults, as always speak their truth each in their own way and made us all the stronger.








COVID PROCEEDURES

We continue to ask parents to be especially vigilant about Covid. If your child is displaying any cold/flu symptoms, regardless of if they're testing negative to Covid, they need to remain at home until symptom free to break the cycle of illnesses being spread. Our current school policy remains that if your child tests positive to Covid they must isolate for 7days and return a negative RAT on day 6 in order to return after 7days. If someone in your household tests positive, then your child is deemed a close contact and must isolate for 5days and return a negative RAT prior to returning to school.

Your Side and the Benevolent Society understand it can often create more stress if your child does not know someone who is suddenly caring for them.

They have assured us that a family from St Lucy's in need of emergency respite can use a support worker known to them, or alternatively a worker sourced by Carer Gateway.

For support workers known to your family but not known to Carer Gateway, they need to provide the following for services to be provided in an emergency situation.

- Working with Childrens Check
- National Police Check or NDIS Worker Screening check
- Evidence of vaccinations
- Any relevant qualifications that may be required in supporting a young person with high needs.
- Basic contact details (address, phone, email)
- An ABN or name of employer
- Payment details (can be provided post service via invoicing)

And don't forget Carer Gateway also offer Tailored Support Packages as well as Counselling for Carers.



What is Travel Training?

Being able to travel safely on your own using public transport is an important life skill and gives people independence and the ability to get around in the community. Someone with a disability may need extra training and support to learn this skill. This is where travel training comes in.

If you want to catch public transport to get to school, post-school options, study, work or leisure activities, travel training will help you develop the confidence and skills to make it happen.

You can learn about:

- > catching trains, buses and ferries
- Opal cards and other ways to pay
- how to plan trips
- safe road crossings
- > which services to catch
- > where to get on and off
- accessible services
- > travelling safely
- > strategies to deal with emergencies
- what to do when things go wrong
- using public transport apps
- managing behavioural challenges
