FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Parents,

Memorial Service for Sanad:

Thank you to our whole St Lucy's community of families and others from the wider community for attending the Memorial Service for Sanad Shahriar last week where we came together in solidarity and loss. Over 200 people attended and some came from interstate. We had many notes of support and remembrance from those who were not able to attend, reminding us that they were praying for Sanad's family as well as the school.

It was an opportunity to pray for Sanad's family. To give thanks for our own first responders on staff who were quickly joined by the emergency services that afternoon.

We continue to be so grateful for the support of so many in the days that have followed.

Although a sad time, it was also an opportunity to reflect on the joy that Sanad brought to our school and remember him as a kind, cheeky, vivacious, clever and beautiful boy. We continue to pray for his family at this time and ask God to help relieve their sorrow.

Opportunities for Engaged Learning:

As we have begun to return to more normal activities, it is pleasing to report on the great opportunities for engaged learning that have been taking place through the year, two examples of which follow. Early Stage 1 and Stage 1 Phonics and Writing: These classes have been working on phonics and writing skills. In Camellia Class students have been learning about letter-sounds and building Consonant, Vowel, Consonant words. In Magnolia class, students have been working on a range of writing skills including practising letter formation for name writing, organising ideas for news writing and formulating an opinion. Both stages use a range of ways to help students engage with their learning, including the use of hands-on materials, technology and pen and paper.

Robotics and PLC Pymble

Robotics also occurred this week. Once again, our students thrived in this technology space and built great collaborations with their mainstream visitors. The engagement and shared learning was so wonderful to observe.

Over the past 3 terms, a small group of our Stage 3 students have been working closely with a Stage 3 group of PLC students on Robotics. Each week the girls came and taught a new skill to our students, who mastered them in minutes. At the same time, we taught the PLC girls how to Key Word Sign (KWS) and use Augmentative and Alternative Communication (AAC) to communicate with their peers.

As staff, we learned so many things – the biggest was that when we use technology there are NO BARRIERS for our students.

Some of the favourite activities were: designing catapults on the DASH Robots to fling ping pong balls; using Lego to design forklifts for the DASH robots; and designing obstacle courses for the Robots to move through.

Ms Grimmond, our Head of Curriculum and Pedagogy K-6 said "This Robotics was some of the deepest connection to mainstream students as well as to deep learning I have seen in my career with 100% engagement. The PLC girls presented their learnings to their junior school and it was the friendships made that they valued most of all. We have big plans for this program and can't wait to share more with you."

Combined Arts with Abbotsleigh

This week included a final visit for 2023 from our Combined Arts partners from Abbotsleigh School. We have been delighted to have this important program back on the school calendar after a 3-year hiatus due to Covid-19. Over several months, St Lucy's and Abbotsleigh students created artworks and Dance choreography together during a series of workshops designed to offer a shoulder-to-shoulder experience. Students had the opportunity to forge connections that we hope will make a long-lasting impact on all who participated.

Men's Night at St Lucy's:

We had a very enthusiastic group of 20 dads and grandparents attend the school from St Lucy's and St Edmunds last night. Anna Schwarz, our former school psychologist presented on the topic of Building Resilience and Coping Skills for Challenging Times. Thanks to Warren Hopley for organising this event.

The Veritas Lift Repairs:

It is important for parents to be aware that SafeWork has an obligation to return the Veritas lift to safe working order. I want parents to be reassured that the school will not be using the lift this year even when it is handed back to us and certified as safe and ready for use. The lift will continue to be hoarded up until at least the start of next year.

COVID PROCEEDURES

We continue to ask parents to be especially vigilant about Covid as we come to the end of the term. If your child is displaying any cold/ flu symptoms, regardless of if they're testing negative to Covid, they need to remain at home until symptom free to break the cycle of illnesses being spread. Our current school policy remains that if your child tests positive to Covid they must isolate for 7 days and return a negative RAT on day 6 in order to return after 7 days. If someone in your household tests positive, then your child is deemed a close contact and must isolate for 5 days and return a negative RAT prior to returning to school.

All our students were absolute stars, and it was so wonderful to see them experience this special occasion.








HIGH SCHOOL HIGHLIGHTS

INFORMATION FROM OUR POST SCHOOL OPTIONS CO-ORDINATOR

How it works

The Social Worker will discuss your public transport needs and plan the safest route with you. They travel with you as you learn a route, with repeat practice sessions, until you can travel independently with confidence. The service is personalised and flexible, helping you deal with any challenges. Our training methods and programs are tailored to suit your needs and learning styles.

The cost

Living Skills Training is a NDIS provider, with Social Workers delivering travel training and skills development. Services are covered under the NDIS or can be self-funded.





What is Travel Training?

Being able to travel safely on your own using public transport is an important life skill and gives people independence and the ability to get around in the community. Someone with a disability may need extra training and support to learn this skill. This is where travel training comes in.

If you want to catch public transport to get to school, post-school options, study, work or leisure activities, travel training will help you develop the confidence and skills to make it happen.

You can learn about:

- > catching trains, buses and ferries
- > Opal cards and other ways to pay
- > how to plan trips
- > safe road crossings
- > which services to catch
- > where to get on and off
- > accessible services
- > travelling safely
- > strategies to deal with emergencies
- > what to do when things go wrong
- > using public transport apps
- > managing behavioural challenges


