#### **Catherine Centre Construction:**

The Catherine Centre (High School) construction continues at pace. All the roofing is now on and weatherproof and consequently the fit out has commenced in earnest upstairs. While there have been longer than expected landscaping works during Term 1, I am pleased to let you know that the new Spyder, renovated Nun's Garden (near our Prouille entry) and the covered walkway from the CAC to the new building will be handed over in readiness for Term 2. This will enable us to expand our play space in the oval area when we return. A blessing for students and staff alike.



#### **Veritas Lift:**

As we end Term 1 and think about resuming in Term 2, I want to make clear that the Veritas Lift will not be used or in operation during Term 2. It will remain hoarded up and non-operational. As you are aware from previous communications in the Newsletter and from my comments to the P&F meeting, investigations into the lift continue and will do so for the foreseeable future by the various authorities – Police/Coroner, SafeWork, lift company and independent lift experts. As I have said previously, when more information comes to hand about the various investigations into the incident of 1 November 2023 this will be passed on to parents and our school community. In the meantime, for Term 2 the Veritas lift will remain closed and out of sight.


#### Glider class researches "Past and Present"

In our unit of work "Past and Present" we learnt about the Harbour Bridge.


#### Did you know?
